Nursing program that I am applying to (CHECK ONE BOX PER APPLICATION):

- Nursing (Evening/Weekend) may include some daytime requirements.  
Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale at the time of application.
- Nursing (Traditional day) may include some evening or weekend requirements.  
Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale at the time of application.

Students who wish to enter a nursing program must meet the criteria. Applicants who have completed all the requirements for admission will be accepted on a space-available basis. If completion of the criteria occurs after the incoming class is filled, students will be admitted into the next available class.

### RN College Option

#### Admission Requirements

- Successful completion of any required developmental courses based on college readiness standards (See Counseling and Advising Center for additional information)
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale at the time of application and admission.
  
- The following four courses (or equivalent courses from a regionally accredited college) should be completed **prior** to applying for admission into the nursing program:
  - BIOL 2210 Anatomy and Physiology I
  - ENGL 1110 English Composition I (A) or ENGL 1111 English Composition I (B)
  - MATH 1330 Statistics for the Health Sciences or MATH 1550 Statistics
  - PSYC 1500 Introduction to Psychology

All courses need to be completed with a "C" grade or higher with the exception of BIOL 2210 Anatomy and Physiology I which needs to be completed with a "B" grade or higher.

BIOL 2210 Anatomy and Physiology I and MATH 1330 Statistics for the Health Sciences or MATH 1550 Statistics may be taken a total of two times each.

Student placement will occur on a space available basis.

***All students enrolled in a nursing or allied health program/certificate must complete a criminal background check. In accordance with clinical site requirements, students with a criminal record maybe ineligible to participate in a clinical course/rotation/practicum resulting in ineligibility to complete the nursing program. Delays, for any reason, in obtaining background results may cause an interruption in course sequence and/or inability to complete program requirements. Additional background screening may be required. Drug testing and vaccinations are required in accordance with clinical affiliation requirements. Students will be required to successfully pass a physical examination without restriction.***
