

College Credit Plus (CCP) Registration Worksheet Guide

When deciding which courses to take through CCP you need to ask yourself a number of questions. This guide is designed to help you answer the questions you must address when determining which CCP course you want to take over the course of the *entire next academic year*. It is strongly suggested that you work with your high school guidance counselor when completing the registration work sheet.

You should bring the **COMPLETED** registration worksheet with you to the CCP Orientation and Registration Session. Instructions for scheduling a CCP Orientation and Registration Session can be found in your acceptance packet.

Selecting your courses:

- 1) What classes do you still need to complete in order to graduate from high school?

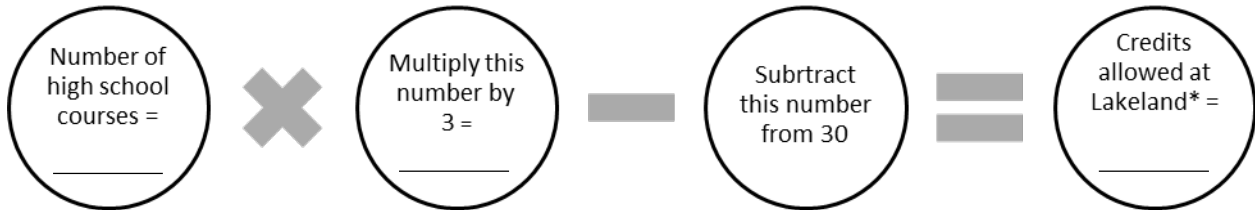
Outstanding High School Graduation Requirements:

- 2) What Lakeland courses are “course equivalents” for your remaining high school graduation requirements? (see high school CCP course equivalency guides at lakelandcc.edu/CCP under the “Equivalency Tools” on the left of the screen)

Example: POLS 1300	3

- 3) How many CCP courses are you eligible to enroll in through CCP based on your high school course enrollment?

To calculate: Multiply the number of full year high school courses that are not available as college credit times 3 and then subtract from 30. Example 1: A student is taking concert choir all year. 1 course x 3 = 3. 30-3 =27. The student is eligible to take 27 credits through CCP. Example 2: Government is one semester (0.5 credits) and band is a full year (1 credit). 1.5 x 3 = 4.5. 30 – 4.5 = 25.5. The student is eligible to take 25.5 credits through CCP.



*Keep this number in mind. If a student exceeds the 30 credit hour limit, the entire cost of the class will be assessed to the student at the residency rate. Textbook costs will also be charged.

- 4) Are you planning to take CCP classes at your high school, at Lakeland, online, or a combination? To see course offerings, visit the online schedule viewer at lakelandcc.edu/schedule

It is expected that students will **spend 2 to 3 hours**, minimally, outside of the classroom/laboratory performing course related work such as readings, research, homework assignments, practica, studio work, and other academic work for every hour of instruction spent in the classroom/laboratory.
