PURPOSE:

Lakeland Community College’s Strategic Plan is a fluid, dynamic plan involving stakeholders campuswide. Headcount and FTE Enrollment:

Each fall and spring semester, the Institutional Research Department creates the Enrollment Highlights Reportⁱ capturing enrollment data at time of censusⁱⁱ. The report provides an in-depth analysis of student enrollment as well as student characteristics and demographics.

CCSSE Results:

Every three years, Lakeland participates in the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE)ⁱⁱⁱ, which was last administered during the Spring 2023 semester. The survey fosters analysis of student behaviors and institutional practices that are highly correlated with student learning and retention. Graduate Exit Survey:

Lakeland's Graduate Exit Survey is administered on a rolling basis throughout the academic year as students apply for graduation. The survey provides insight into the graduates' satisfaction with their educational experiences at Lakeland. Once per academic year, the Institutional Research Department creates a Graduate Exit Survey Report, summarizing the results from the summer, fall, and spring graduate application windows. Fall-to-Fall Retention:

Fall-to-fall retention^{iv} is the percentage of entering first-time degree/certificate-seeking students enrolled as of the 15th day of fall term who either re-enroll (in at least one credit-bearing class) or successfully complete a program by the 15th day of the following fall semester. Retention of first-time college students is reported to the Department of Education Integrated Postsecondary Enrollment Data System (IPEDS).

Fall-to-Spring Persistence:

Fall-to-Spring persistence^v is the percentage of entering first-time degree/certificate-seeking students enrolled as of the 15th day of fall term who either re-enroll (in at least one credit-bearing class) or successfully complete a program by the 15th day of the following spring semester.

Graduation & Transfer Rates:

The three-year graduation rate^{vi} is the percentage of first-time, full-time degree/certificate-seeking students enrolled for credit on the 15th day of the fall entry term who complete a degree or certificate by the end of August of the third year. Three-year graduation rates of first-time college students are reported to IPEDS.

The transfer-out rate^{vii} is the percentage of first-time, full-time degree/certificate seeking students enrolled for credit on the 15th day of the fall entry term (cohort) that left the institution without completing a program and enrolled at another institution by the fourth year. Transfer-out rates of first-time, full-time colleges students are reported to IPEDS.

College Credit Plus Enrollment:

According to the Ohio Department of Higher Education, “College Credit Plus is Ohio’s dual enrollment program that provides students in grades 7-12 the opportunity to earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking courses from Ohio colleges or universities. The purpose of this program is to enhance students’ career readiness and postsecondary success, while providing a wide variety of options to college-ready students, at no or limited costs to students and families.”^{viii}

New Enrollment in Workforce Training Programs:

Lakeland's Basic Police Academy^x is administered by the College in conjunction with the Ohio Peace Officers Training Council (OPOTC). The Basic Policy Academy is required training to become a police officer in the state of Ohio. To maintain a safe and quality learning environment, the size of a police academy class will not exceed 30 students/cadets.
