Internet services qualify as an emergency need, and Lakeland has funds available for students to receive assistance to pay these costs if students are facing a risk of disconnection.

FCC Affordable Connectivity Program

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC benefit program that helps ensure that households can afford the broadband they need for work, school, healthcare and more.

The benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service for eligible households. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Affordable Connectivity Program is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

There are two steps to enroll:

1. Go to AffordableConnectivity.gov to submit an application or print out a mail-in application.
2. Contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete. Eligible households must *both* apply for the program *and* contact a participating provider to select a service plan.

Spectrum:

Spectrum is participating in a new government-sponsored stimulus program. Your household may be eligible to subscribe to a program that will allow you to save up to \$30 a month on your Internet service.
