Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory grade option now available until April 24

We realize that some students are facing personal, family and financial challenges as a result of this unprecedented pandemic. Therefore, we are offering more flexibility for students to choose to take some courses on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory (S/U) basis. A grade of "S" or "U" does not become part of the calculation of a student's grade point average ("gpa"). Students are highly encouraged to connect with a counselor to determine if taking a course as an S/U is a good option for them. To schedule an appointment with a counselor via telephone or web conference, call 440.525.7200.

For the Spring Semester 2020 only:

Students may choose to take some courses on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory (S/U) basis. A maximum of **12** satisfactory/unsatisfactory semester credit hours may be applied toward an associate degree. (The current policy is a maximum of 10 credits.)

Credit(s) will be granted (recorded as an "S" on the student's transcript) for courses taken with this option if a "C" grade or better was earned

The request to take a course on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory (S/U) basis must be submitted to the Student Service Center by the end of the 14th week (April 24, 2020) of the semester. (The current policy is by the end of the fourth week of the semester.)

This option may not be changed to a letter grade.

Exceptions:

- 1. Some restricted/selective admission programs require traditional letter grades for their core course requirements.
- 2. International students are not eligible to utilize the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory option.
- 3. CCP students may not be eligible to utilize the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory option.
